<b>01/04/61</b>	<b>Parkersburg</b>	<b>Political Meeting in Parkersburg to vote against secession and instruct delegates to Richmond Legislature to vote against secessaion movement.</b>
<b>04/01/61</b>	<b>Parkersburg</b>	– Lindapages – Co A of Home Guards by Dr J W Moss and J. P Kiger to protect city and take possession of 400 flint lock muskets and two pieces of artillery, sent from Harper’s Ferry and stowed in Jail. The sheriff and many city officials sympathized with seceding states, and making boxses to ship arms to Richmond, sixty men from company from city hall, 15 April, headed by John Jackson and demanded arms.. Broke into jail and put in city hall to be guarded day and night for two weeks, when 14 Ohio, came and took possession (first troops to enter Pburg.

We jumped ashore, and for the first time in our lives inhaled the “sacred atmosphere of the so-called Southern Confederacy. ... We proceeded a few miles out of town, and at midnight halted, pitched our tents, stationed guards, and all ..were soon sound asleep.... At sunrise on the 30th , we marched to the depot of the north-western branch of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, and, after a hard half-day’s work in loading our guns, horses and wagons, stowed ourselves away in cattle cars, ... As we rattled along over the railroad, .. After passing a small shanty, called Petroleum, from the numerous oil-wells in the vicinity, we met with the first really hard work ... Here the rebels had burnt one of the railroad bridges, and all hands had to “fall in” and repair damages. Never did men work with a better will...For two days and nights we toiled and ceased not, and when, on the evening of the second day, we passed over
